Jackson County Parks + Rec and the Truman Library invite you to take an exciting trip back in time!

Practice the basics of scientific inquiry using archaeological data. Learn how archaeologists investigate and interpret past cultures and peoples. Finally, learn how to incorporate all of this into your classrooms or other settings. Archaeology is an excellent tool for engaging youth in science education.

Participants will receive full instruction in archaeological science for the classroom and complete curriculum guide and materials.

During this workshop, participants will investigate an historic 1869 farmstead. Using data from an actual excavation at the farmstead, students will learn how archaeologists study the past. Studies of such farmsteads and farm residences are appropriate in Missouri since many similar sites are found throughout the state. The workshop will also participate in activities at the Truman Library and engage in archaeological fieldwork (optional) at the Lone Jack Battlefield Museum.
